Some vaccines are considered essential (and even mandatory) for all cats, whether indoor or outdoor, but the exact number of vaccinations recommended for your cat will depend on their previous vaccines and lifestyle. On average, if an adult cat has received all of their initial kitten vaccinations, they will need about two-three vaccines at each annual visit.
